Speaker Bios

Dr. René Gifford is an Associate Professor at Vanderbilt University, Director of the Cochlear Implant Program in the Department of Hearing and Speech Sciences, and the Director of the Cochlear Implant Research Laboratory. Her research has been funded by the NIDCD for nearly 15 years and focuses on combined electric and acoustic hearing including basic auditory function, spatial hearing, and speech perception. She has over 70 peer-reviewed papers and is the author of the book entitled "Cochlear Implant Patient Assessment: Evaluation of Candidacy, Performance, and Outcomes."

Dr. Lyn Turkstra is Assistant Dean for Speech-Language Pathology and member of the MiNDS institute at McMaster University in Ontario, Canada; and is board-certified in neurologic communication disorders by the Academy of Neurological Communication Disorders and Sciences (ANCDS). A speech-language pathologist by training, she studies the relation of cognition to communication, with a focus on social communication in adolescents and young adults with traumatic brain injury. Dr. Turkstra is an author on over 85 peer-reviewed publications, including evidence-based practice guidelines for intervention in acquired brain injury, and is co-author of the text, *Optimizing Cognitive Rehabilitation: Effective Instructional Methods*, with McKay Moore Sohlberg.
